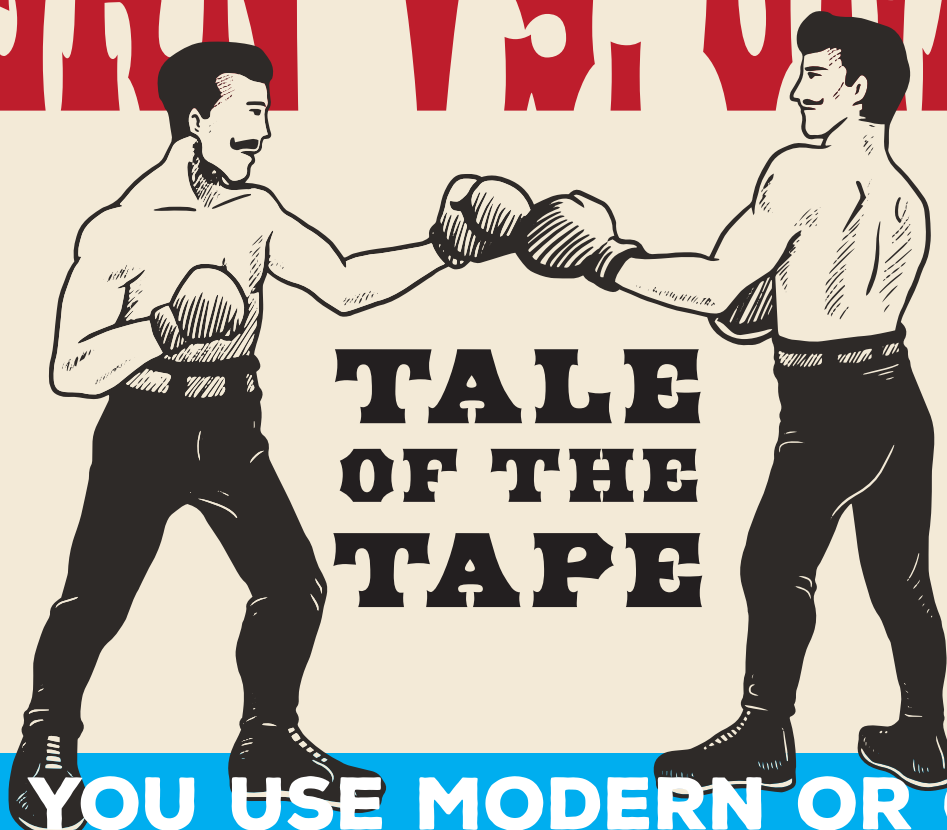

# MODERN VS. CLASSIC



## SHOULD YOU USE MODERN OR CLASSIC?

### Consider “**Modern**” if:

Your organization is new to SharePoint

You have little need or desire to “brand” your Intranet

Your organization accepts that design customization is limited

You do not want a highly customized Intranet

You want to minimize administrative overhead

You want search results to be more tailored to the current user

You want the intranet to work on all form factors and browsers

You want to use Microsoft’s point products (Teams, Outlook, Yammer, Skype, Power BI, Forms, Flow, PowerApps, Planner, etc.) instead of the SharePoint’s classic capabilities (tasks, calendars, Business Connectivity Services, etc.)

You do not have any 3rd party SharePoint Tools (Such as Nintex workflow or custom web parts).

You want to control development in SharePoint

You have no plans to develop within SharePoint

### Consider “**Classic**” if:

You have a substantial investment in SharePoint sites where pages are used to compose and link Apps and lists together

You want to highly customize or brand your Intranet

You want to use “Roll-up” capabilities (“Modern’s” ability to consolidate data from different sites is poor)

You want to follow the traditional publishing model

You have custom web parts

You have custom applications

You have 3rd party tools or web parts.

You have Power Users who want to tailor the way their sites work.

You want to easily inject JavaScript onto pages

You are concerned about the way permissions to documents can be granted

You want to target specific information to specific audiences

You want to filter web part data based on a URL parameter
